End of Covid restrictions

Now that the government has lifted most Covid restrictions the club will follow government policy with regard to our operations this season. This means:

- the clubhouse will be fully open

- pre-booking is not required for jitneys (hurrah says Ed)
- we will resume payment for jitneys with prize money being given to the winners
- the jitney cost will be \$1

Members do not have to provide proof of vaccination and mask wear is optional.

There will no longer be a need to keep one empty rink between each rink in play and we will resume delivery of the jack by the leads.

Who is a novice bowler?

A bowler is classed as a novice during their first five years of bowling. For example someone who started bowling in 2016 would be able to play in novice tournaments up to and including 2020. However, since there has been no official play in 2020 and 2021 a 2016 bowler is still classified as a novice for 2022. A bowler who started between 2016 and 2019 is given two extra years.

Ontario Championships

Entry to the Ontario Fours, Pairs and singles is open which means anyone can enter. To play in the remaining events, novice combination fours (a new event), mixed pairs, seniors, triples and novice singles you have to qualify through District playdowns. If you win your District playdown you proceed to the Ontario championships for the event as District champion. The Ontario mixed pairs and seniors champions then qualify for the national championships. There are no national championships for novice combination fours, triples or novice singles.

I would encourage the novices in the club to seriously think about entering a team in the novice combination fours. There have to be two women and two men on the team. It is a new event and is a different format to normal. Contact me for more details.



As time goes by we will develop this section of the website even further. If you have any ideas or suggestions for improvements please let me know. I hope you will find this development useful. I know that many of you liked having a printed Yearbook but having information on-line makes it more readily available and we can update it at a moment's notice. If you would like a printed copy of the calendar please let me know.

Finally, as mentioned in Carol's item (Help wanted) I would like to make a plea for a volunteer to assist me with the website and to learn how to post material. At present I'm the only person who can edit the website and knows the password! You don't have to be an IT genius, it's all user friendly.

OLBA -- What do they do?

Part of your membership fees goes to the Ontario Lawn Bowls Association, currently \$35 for every adult member. So what do they do with that affiliation fee? OLBA Director and Cobourg club Secretary Nan Hendren gives you the lowdown on what they do.

- Establish policies and procedures in compliance with the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport for funding requirements as a PSO - Provincial Sport Organization
- Organize and manage the District and Provincial play down tournaments to determine representative teams from Ontario to play in the national BCB championships
- 3. On-going communication with member (117) clubs through the District Chairs, club presidents, the Annual, website, social media, YouTube, email
- 4. Provide clubs with necessary Insurance coverage for liability
- Provide clubs Marketing support for membership drives
- Develop and delivery Coaching and Umpire certification programs in compliance with Bowls Canada
- 7. Develop Long Term Athletic Development programs -- learn to play, learn to compete
- 8. Volunteer recognition and appreciation awards program including Hall of Fame induction
- 9. Provide assistance and guidance to clubs with respect to:
- Return to play protocols for COVID-19
- Grant applications
- Greens care and maintenance
- Governance By-laws, Policies and procedures
- Strategic planning and operational plans

OLBA Districts

The 117 Ontario bowling clubs belong to one of 16 Districts. Cobourg is in District 14 and the other clubs in District 14 are Bobcaygeon, Cannington, Lindsay, Oshawa, Peterborough, Pickering, Port Perry and Whitby. We have a District 14 Committee consisting of (currently) Chair (Bill Arthur), first vice chair (Alan Steffen, Oshawa) and a second vice chair (Alan Hudson, Bobcaygeon). The role of the District Committee is to co-ordinate the schedule of open tournaments for publication by the OLBA; to organise District playdowns; to communicate with clubs on various issues; to provide feedback to the OLBA on grassroots issues.

Committee members serve two years in their post with others moving up. So my term of office will end in October 2022 at which time Alan Steffen will take over as Chair, Alan Hudson as first vice chair and there will be a vacancy for the second vice chair.
