Baylee van Steijn

As mentioned in the editor's notes Baylee van Steijn has been chosen as one of the five member ladies team competing at the World Championships later this year. This is a much deserved accolade for 22 year old Baylee and the culmination of many years of hard work and gradual progression through the lawn bowling ranks.

Baylee started bowling at the Cobourg Lawn Bowling Club when she was 8 years old. With expert coaching from Sharyl Ann Milligan she soon came to the fore in youth bowling and on two occasions in 2014 and 2015 was Ontario youth bowler of the year. Her first national recognition came in 2016 when, as a member of the Canadian Development squad, she competed in the North American Challenge against the USA. In 2018 she played again in the North American Challenge and in that same year she made her first overseas trip as a member of the Canadian team competing in a ten nations challenge in Wales, coming home with a bronze medal. In 2019 she won the gold medal at the Ontario youth singles.

After a two year break in competition due to Covid van Steijn enjoyed a successful season in 2022 winning the silver medal in the Ontario Pairs with Jake Masterson of the Peterborough club. They went on to win the bronze medal at the Canadian National Championships.

The World Championships will be played at the Gold Coast in Queensland, Australia between August 29th and September 10th.

The Laws Of The Sport Of Bowls

The official rules for Lawn Bowling are established by World Bowls. These rules (Laws) are published in detail in a booklet titled "Laws of the Sport of Bowls". Some rules are modified occasionally and new booklets are printed. The current booklet is the 132 page 2022 addition called 'Crystal Mark 4th Edition". Copies are available for sale at the club (\$14).

The rules as printed are meant to be enforced in all major competitions. The 'Controlling Bodies' of a competition or club game may alter some aspects of the rules to suit the type of competitions they are playing. In games played at our club such as Jitneys & Club tournaments (which are not events leading to a Provincial Championship) the Club is the Controlling Body.

We have not gone over every rule in the book but I have outlined a couple of the situations that come up quite frequently during play at our club where the club has decided to apply the rules as noted below.

Note: Club players are not expected to know the exact rules for every situation that comes up and not every situation is covered in the rules. If in doubt of the rule players should use their <u>common sense and a spirit of fair play when making decisions.</u>

Bowls from one rink going into the adjoining rink

- If the bowl going into the adjoining rink is on the wrong bias then any player from either rink may stop it.
- If a bowl at rest is in danger of being moved by a bowl in motion from the adjoining rink then any player from either rink may choose to lift the bowl at rest to allow the other bowl to pass and then replace it as long as this action would not influence the outcome of the head . . . or . . . stop the bowl in motion. If the bowl in motion from the adjoining rink was on the correct bias and may have returned to its own rink it may be replayed.

Note: The original rules are written for Championship play on rinks wider than ours and where this situation occurs much less frequently.

Note: Where a bowl can not be safely stopped it should be allowed to hit the bowl in the adjoining rink. i.e. do not risk injury by running to stop a bowl.

In all cases common sense should be used before entering a neighbouring rink and moving bowls.
