Attention all novices - and that means most of you.



Who is a novice bowler? The answer is anyone who has been bowling for 5 years or less. However since 2020 was lost to Covid the Ontario Lawn Bowls Association (OLBA) extends this time limit by one year. That means anyone who joined in 2017 is still eligible to play in novice tournaments in 2023. There are three

events in which novice bowlers may want to think about entering.

The first is the Ontario Combo Fours. District 14 playdowns will be held on July 29th and 30th at a venue to be decided. The winners will play in the Ontario Championships which are being held in Pickering on August 26th and 27th. I won't go into the format of Novice Combo Fours but you can find out all about it from the Cobourg team that entered last year, Terry Dyche, Gail Cunningham, Sheri Perkins and Brent Perkins. There is an article about it in the September 2022 Newsletter.

Many of our novices entered the novice singles playdowns in Bobcaygeon last year and thoughly enjoyed it. The venue for the District 14 playdowns is to be decided but will be held on September 2nd and 3rd. The Ontario Championship for men will be held in Tilbury and the ladies here in Cobourg on September 23rd and 24th.

There are also some open tournaments which are either for novices only or teams which must have at least one novice. You can find details of those in the OLBA tournament listings that Bob Bates talked about last month.

Louisa and I have been sponsoring a triples open tournament here in Cobourg for several years and have decided that to encourage novice bowlers into tournament play this year the tournament will be novices only. It will be held on Thurday August 10th and we would love to have lots of entries. Speak to Bob Bates or me for further details of that.



From the Archives

As we get ready for opening day here is a look back at an article about our opening day in May 2017 from Northumberland Today. In those days when we had a daily newspaper a report was carried every week of the season on lawn bowling activities.

110th lawn bowling season gets rolling in Cobourg

Mayor Gil Brocanier got the Cobourg Lawn Bowling Club season underway Saturday, May 13.

The mayor was a guest of the club for a celebratory lunch and after that spoke about what a great achievement it was for a Cobourg sports club to be celebrating 110 years.

He spoke about the health benefits of lawn bowling, the social aspects of the sport and the joy it brings to non-bowlers who stop to watch as they walk through Victoria Park. He then formally opened the season by rolling the first bowl.

The rain that had been called for stayed away and after the opening ceremonies members enjoyed an opening day jitney which was won by the team of Carol Dewey, Vince Tamburello and Thelma Eastcott.

The first week of the season has been a very busy one with schools visiting to learn about the sport and on Thursday the club was scheduled to host the OSGA55+District 12 lawn bowling tournament. And this Saturday, May 20

is the annual open house. People are encouraged to come and try out the sport and there will be a barbeeue lunch available.

For those who are working their way through the ParticipAction 150 playlist this is also an opportunity to cross lawn bowling off their list. People who are not lawn bowlers are also welcome to visit and take a look inside the historic club house and check out the display about the club's history. The club will have information on display at the Farmers Market so whilst visiting the market there is an opportunity to visit and then head down to Victoria Park to find out more and 'Give it a Try."

The holiday weekend will conclude with an Open Fours tournament sponsored by Lauria Hyundai and we will have reports of all these events for you next week.
