After many years of coaching and mentoring young bowlers, Sharyl Ann Milligan is stepping down from her post. Youth bowlers are the future of the sport and we are keen to continue to develop a strong youth section. The EC is looking at the best way to organise youth bowling in the future and is looking for members who can help. Youths meet on Monday and Wednesday afternoons in July and August. Yearbook

We told you in the December Newsletter that the EC had decided not to publish a Yearbook in future. All the information that used to go in the Yearbook will be available on the club website. A paper copy of the calendar will be available for those who want one.

Seniors Community Grant

Also in December we told you that we had received a grant of \$4,750 from the Ontario Trillium Fund. The grant was for IT equipment that has enabled us to produce a promotional video about the club to help with recruitment. The equipment will also be used for coaching club members on a one to one basis and in club coaching clinics. We have bought a laptop, monitor, projector and iPad plus some video editing software. We have also been able to buy some new club bowls.

Club Website

The grant has also enabled us to upgrade the club website from a free version to a more professional version which has more functionality.

This has allowed us to remove the weebly branding from the website and from the domain name. The new domain is simply

Part of the new functionality is that we can create a members only section on the website. This is under development at present but this part of the website will be password protected and you will be able to access it with your own id and password. We will let you have more details in due course.

You will recall that we always published a list of members and contact details in the Yearbook and we intend to publish those details on the members only section of the website. It is hoped that most members will be happy to have their phone number and email address included, given the password protection. However, if you do not want your contact details included please advise Bill Arthur.

Membership Fees

Despite the financial pressures of the last two years and the fact that the OLBA/Bowls Canada affiliation fees have increased to \$35. the EC has decided to leave the club fees at the 2019 level. So a season bowling will remain at \$175 and the new bowler fee at \$140.

Membership

Lots of you have not bowled dince 2019 and that is understandable given what has happened over the last two years. You may have gotten out of the habit and are not bothered about resuming bowling but just think about how much you enjoyed meeting friends and bowling. There are between 30 and 40 members who have not bowled since 2019 and we would love to see you back again. So get your bowls out in May and "return to bowls".

Grants

During the winter we applied for a New Horizons for Seniors Grant to replace all the ditchboards around the greens. We also applied for an Ontario Trillium Resilent Communities Grant which is to help organisations recover from the pandemic. If successful this will enable us to mount a major advertising campaign for new members. We should hear whether or not we have been successful in the next month.

Promotional Video

In the next week or so we will be publishing a club promotional video on YouTube and will advise you by email when it is available. This is just one strand in our efforts to recover from Covid and start to build our membership back to what it was in 2019. There will be details on our website, Facebook and Twitter. We will let you have more details of how you can help spread the word when the video is published.
